

**IROC SYSTEMS CORP. ANNOUNCES THE HIRING OF A NEW GENERAL MANAGER
AND THE APPOINTMENT OF WILLIAM AUSTIN TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS; IROC
SYSTEMS CORP. RETAINS KPMG, CHARTERED ACCOUNTANTS AS AUDITORS; IROC SYSTEMS
CORP. SELLS MOBILE MEDICAL DIVISION TO KEY SAFETY SERVICES INC.**

Calgary, AB/ January 5, 2005/ - Tom Alford, President and CEO of IROC Systems Corp. ("IROC" or the "Company") (TSXV:ISC) is pleased to announce that IROC has hired Wyatt Wutzke as General Manager of the Company's operations. Mr. Wutzke has over fifteen (15) years experience in the oil and gas industry in Calgary, most recently with Weatherford Canada.

Mr. Alford also commented that "we are very excited with the addition of Wyatt to the IROC team. His experience in Calgary and knowledge of the oil and gas service business will provide a strong complement to our existing management."

Mr. Wutzke's will commence his employment with IROC on January 17, 2005.

Mr. Alford commented that "as IROC's growth accelerates we are also pleased to announce the addition of William Austin to our Board of Directors effective immediately. Mr. Austin, a native of Houston, Texas, has a strong background in all financial aspects of public companies, having held the position of CFO in billion dollar market capitalization companies in the recent past. This brings our company's Board to four (4) members with additional candidates expected to join at our next annual meeting, pending shareholder approval."

Mr. Alford also announced that IROC has retained KPMG, Chartered Accountants of Calgary, Alberta as auditors for the Company. KPMG has been appointed as a result of the resignation of the Company's previous auditors, Brown Smith Owen of Red Deer, Alberta. Brown Smith Owen had submitted its resignation to IROC because the firm had decided not to enter into a Participation Agreement with the Canadian Public Accountability Board and therefore is unable to perform audits for public companies.

Mr. Alford commented that "we are also very pleased that KPMG, Chartered Accountants, has accepted IROC as an audit client and we believe that their expertise will be invaluable in IROC executing its business plan. I would also like to thank Brown Smith Owen for the service that they had provided in the past."

Mr. Alford also announced the IROC has sold its mobile medical division to Key Safety Services Inc. of Sylvan Lake, Alberta. The purchase price was paid in cash.

Mr. Alford commented that "The decision was made to sell off the mobile medical division due to the fact that the business itself did not fall within our core business plan and in order to operate it successfully we would have had to dedicate significantly more capital and time than management felt was justified in the circumstances. Accordingly, management felt that the assets should be sold and the capital be re-invested in IROC's core business lines. The gain on the disposition will be recorded in the fourth quarter of 2004."

IROC Systems Corp. is an Alberta based, oilfield services company that has provided equipment and personnel in the area of downwind air quality monitoring and safety services to the energy sector since 1982. IROC has developed key technologies to address remote air quality monitoring, designed and deployed new air breathing systems and provides a full line of safety services for drilling, completion, production and plant shut down operations. Also, the Company's wireless technologies provide custom solutions and innovative products, which integrate wireless and satellite technologies, to deliver connectivity solutions for specialized markets in a variety of industries. Most recently, the Corporation has added mobile service rigs and a complete range of reclamation and abandonment services through two of its wholly owned subsidiaries, Eagle Well Servicing Corp. and Canstar Environmental Corp.
