

**IROC SYSTEMS CORP.
TO EXPAND 2006 CAPITAL EXPENDITURE PROGRAM**

Calgary, AB / April 11, 2006 / IROC Systems Corp. (“IROC” or the “Company”) (TSX Venture Exchange: “ISC”) announced a significant expansion to its capital expenditure program for the remainder of 2006. The original capital expenditure program of \$16.5 million has been increased by \$19.5 million to \$36.0 million for the year. The proposed capital expenditure program for 2006 now includes the following:

1. Completion of the construction, as previously announced, of six double service rigs – approximately \$12.5 million;
2. Construction of three (3) additional single service rigs – approximately \$5.5 million;
3. Purchase of initial rental and fishing tool inventory for IROC’s new rental division – approximately \$7.9 million;
4. Safety, communication and monitoring equipment – approximately \$3.0 million;
5. Capital assets purchases required to increase Canada Tech Corp.’s manufacturing capacity – approximately \$1.1 million; and
6. Environmental Division – approximately \$1.0 million.

IROC had spent \$5.0 million during the first quarter of 2006 under the original capital expenditure program.

A major portion of the expanded capital expenditure program will be utilized for the completion of the construction of the six double service rigs, the construction of the three additional single service rigs and the build out of the rental and fishing tool inventory for IROC’s rental business. The addition of the nine service rigs during 2006 will bring IROC’s total rig fleet to 28 by the end of the year. Also, the Company plans to acquire the initial rental and fishing tool inventory over the next two quarters in anticipation of having the rental division fully operational for the winter demand.

Mr. Tom Alford, President and Chief Executive Officer of IROC stated that “this dramatic increase in planned capital expenditures for 2006 relates directly to the momentum each of our operating divisions have developed through the continued acceptance of our equipment and services by our customers. In fact, despite this increased capital commitment, customer demand for IROC equipment may not be completely satisfied.” Mr. Alford further added that “the Company continues to build through internal growth initiatives and the expansion of the 2006 capital expenditure program is in response to the opportunities that have developed through such initiatives”.

IROC Systems Corp. is an Alberta based oilfield services company that has provided equipment and personnel in the area of downwind air quality monitoring and safety services to the energy sector since 1982. IROC has developed key technologies to address remote air quality monitoring, designed and deployed new air breathing systems and provides a full line of safety services for

drilling, completion, production and plant shut down operations. Additionally, through the IROC Energy Services Partnership, IROC operates service rigs across Central and Southern Alberta, provides premium communication solutions and is active in the area of environmental reclamation and remediation. Also, through its subsidiary Canada Tech Corp., IROC develops, manufactures and markets a line of tools and systems that measure pressures in the downhole and surface environment of oil and gas wells.
